






participated in the traditional 'Ardha' dance.

distribution ceremony.








D.E.A.R: Drop Everything and Read







First Big Write 2023/24



September saw a flurry of activities and scheduled events on the KAS activities calendar.

Careers Talk for grade 12 and 11

We had careers talk with grade 11 and grade 12 split into two sessions. The session for grade 12 focused on update of careers update worldwide, university courses and entrance requirements to various degree courses with emphasis on Saudi Arabia, the UK and Europe. The session was rounded up with preparations for job interviews and university admission interviews and curriculum vitae (CV).

Grade 11 careers talk was a general introduction of careers and the importance of keeping an open mind and having a plan A, B and C, on careers and university degree courses. The students were keen to know more about top jobs worldwide and several career pathways available. With reference to thirty adjectives that the students might refer to describe themselves to potential employees seemed to provide the needed jolt for action.

Both DP and AD students attended the sessions and both groups appeared excited and motivated by the discussions.





Introduction to the Extended Essay for grade 11 students

Introduction to the Extended Essay session was designed to explain the requirements and importance of Extended Essay. The learning outcome from undertaking the Extended Essay was outlined. Key among the skills acquisition form writing the Extended Essay research and writing skills. There is of course, the importance of academic integrity throughout the Extended Essay stages.

The maximum number of words in the EE is 4000, with a minimum of 3800 words for DP students. The structure and format of the Essay were outlined. Word allowance for AD students was discussed and agreed at 1500 to 2000 words piece of writing on subject of interest.

Going forward, the KAS EE Timeline will be closely followed to ensure that tasks and procedures are on target.



Physics Lab DP1 and DP2

Students in DP1 and DP2 who are studying physics will be lifelong learners throughout and after this academic year as they conduct investigations into real-world physical phenomena. Students have the chance to watch and do research in the areas of Kinematics, including statistical mechanics, as well as Light and Waves thanks to the Physics Lab's full readiness. KAS students use the physics lab facilities as it is fully equipped with all the required resources and equipment.



Chemistry Lab DP1 and DP2

The chemistry lab is fully furnished with apparatus which is an essential part of the DP program. The experiments always scaffold students' lifelong learning. Students are investigating the presence of hydrogen and carbon dioxide by using appropriate apparatus and equipment which is available in KAS's chemistry lab. Titration, confirmation of Acids and Bases, and testing for ammonia ions are being done in the





Separating substances in a heterogenous mixture

Objective: To investigate the impurity of substances available in a heterogenous mixture Students in DP1 investigated different substances in an unknown mixture.

The experiment was done in the Chemistry lab. They applied their scientific skills to analyze the mixture provided to them and came to know that different substances having different amounts were available in the mixture. A number of tools/equipment were provided for them. By using the equipment, they separate the mixture precisely. They came to know that different mounts are available in different mixtures. In future, they will manipulate different materials with different approaches by using several suitable tools to separate impurities in different mixtures in metallurgical industries.





Business Management Students' lead the class

In DP1 business management classes, students have displayed remarkable leadership skills by taking charge of delivering summary lessons to their peers, even within a few weeks of starting the course. This demonstrates their active participation and sense of belonging in the classroom. This student-led approach not only enhances their understanding of the subject matter but also fosters a collaborative learning environment where students can learn from each other and build stronger





Language & Literature (G6)

Suspense is all about building anticipation and tension, creating a sense of curiosity that keeps readers engaged and invested in the story. Our Grade 6 students have been exploring various techniques to master this art.

One of the essential elements of suspenseful writing is a well-developed plot. Our young writers have learned to carefully craft their stories, weaving together intriguing characters, unexpected twists, and intriguing settings. They understand that the journey matters just as much as the destination and have worked diligently to make

every sentence count.





Grade 10

In grade 10, students are actively engaged in the practical aspect of their personal projects, where they learn by applying their knowledge and skills in real-world scenarios. One crucial aspect of this process is understanding how criteria are used to evaluate and mark their current example reports. By following the success criteria outlined in the Personal Project Handbook, students gain a clear understanding of the expectations and standards that their projects should meet. This ensures that their reports are assessed fairly and objectively, allowing them to showcase their learning and growth.







MYP1 Science

Students' first use of the light microscope gave them the chance to investigate the different structures of cells found in all living organisms. They also inquired into the movement of materials in and out of the cell by different processes.



MYP 2 Science

Students' inquiry was focused on the importance of healthy lifestyles. They found out the major nutrients found in food and their importance in keeping our bodies in good condition. They also conducted different tests to identify each nutrient.


Glimpse of PYP Classes KG 2

Math: Counting to four with Pizza!

Learners used different materials in our Math lesson to count numbers up to four. The use of a range of materials to count made our learners more excited to learn. As part of our learning engagement, learners cut pizza into four slices then they numbered them. Next, they drew the correct number of pepperoni pieces on the

slices of pizza to represent the number on the slice.

KG learners visited the science lab and used magnifying glass to observe different materials closely. They find it amazing to see different sizes of the same object by moving the magnifying glass closer and further. The learners develop their communication skills by asking questions and by sharing their thoughts with their peers.


<u>Central Idea: The interaction between human body systems</u> <u>contributes to health and survival</u>

Inquiry into the Human Body Systems:

Below are some snapshots of our exploration through the inquiry cycle.

Tuning In: Provocation to ignite our inquiry and engage student interest. Learners took a surprise visit to the Science Lab where they investigated a real goat's heart. This triggered our inquiry into the first system we explored, which was the circulatory system and the function of our heart.








Sorting Out: We then started

to explore the connection of various body systems, for example the skeletal system.

Learners were surprised to find out that it was our bones that made blood! Likewise, Learners completed a paper puzzle to understand how our bones protect vital organs like our heart and lungs. This helped them to understand the concept

of **connection** and how all systems interact.









Going Further: At this stage of the inquiry learners explored our third line of inquiry 'our responsibility toward our health. We explored healthy and unhealthy habits and how these affect our body systems.

Learners conducted a simple experiment by going through the scientific process to replicate the effects of fizzy drinks on our teeth. They made predictions, observations and conclusions.









Making Conclusions:

Learners went on a field trip to the supermarket to complete a scavenger hunt and review nutrition labels on food and produce to help them make good food choices. They learnt how to check labels for sugar and sodium content.

Taking Action: Learners will invite their mothers in the final week of our inquiry to present their learning about the body systems. They will prepare presentations and short activities for their mothers to complete.

Grade 4

Central idea: Choices of role models may reflect the beliefs and values of individuals and societies

As a 'hook' to tune into their first unit of inquiry, the Grade 4 class gathered as much information about the characteristics of role models.


The students worked in groups to develop their social skills and creativity.


The students worked collaboratively to write the main characteristics of role models and draw pictures that reflect the IB learner profile 'caring.'











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Grade 5








Grade 5 students are tuning in to the 3rd line of inquiry 'Ethical dilemmas associated with manufacturing processes and by-products. In this group session, they inquire into ethical decision making, such as 'Do I play on my phone or sleep early?' and 'Do I play video games or help my sister with her homework?'











After an ethical discussion on the pros and cons of plastics, Grade 5 students created alternative and safer plastic. In these pictures, students showcased their edible and biodegradable plastics as the unit 1 summative assessment task.


